## Editing the answer key after exam performance

## Conclusion

It is possible to edit the answer key after exam performance for the following question types: multiple-choice question, multiple-response question, text-entry question, order question, open question, and matching question.

It is not possible to edit the answer key after exam performance for the following question types: hotspot question, graphic associate question, and drag and drop question. These question types only allow for the removal of an entire question, or the assigning of full points to all students regardless of their answer.

The combined question is the odd one out here, as it is not possible to remove a sub question from the exam, nor to assign full points to all students regardless of their answer.
